LAKE MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

DLSD is continuing efforts to work with 15 property owners to assist with a Healthy Lakes Grant for 2019. Grant approval will be around the middle of April.

Work continues on the Brown's Channel watershed with plans and plantings as weather permits.

DLSD commission decided not to participate in the pellet program for 2019 and research new and better alternatives to helping the lake.

The refurbishing grant to assist in the cost of rehab of one more harvester is scheduled for approval or denial on April 12th.

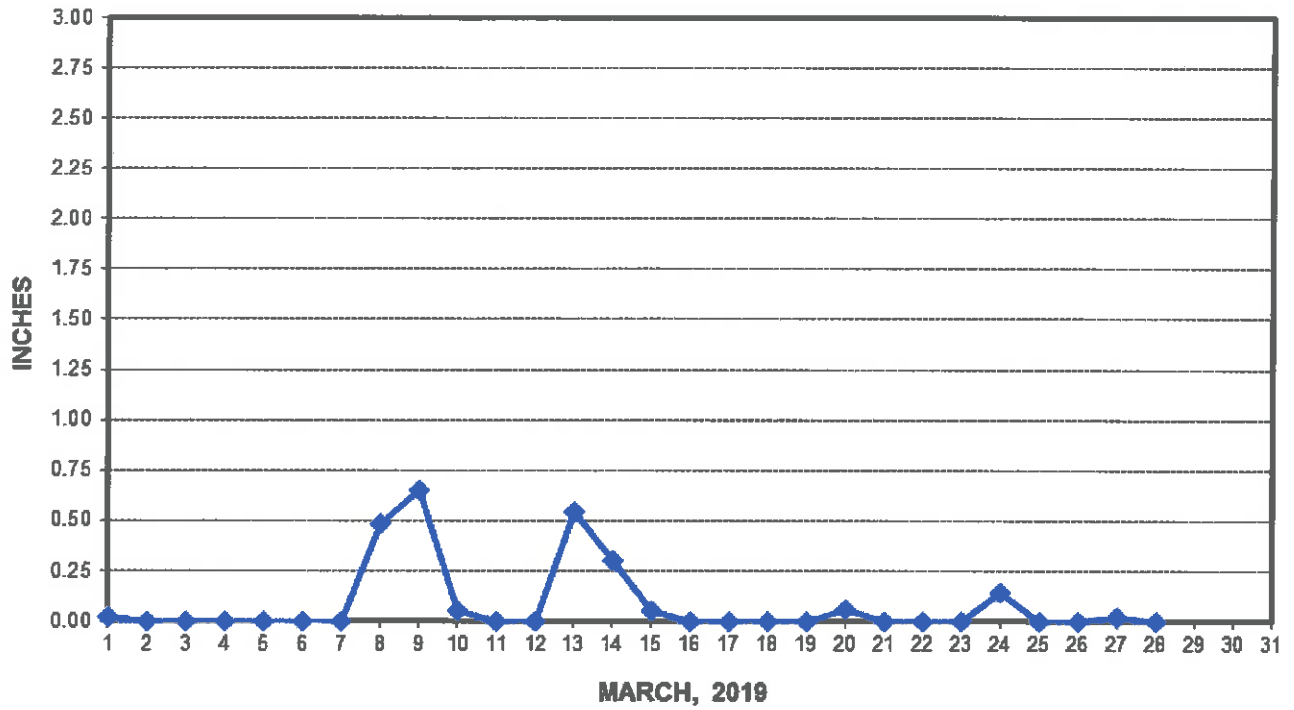
Final preparations of the harvester are underway to prepare for a launch.

The 2019 Chemical Spray permit has been approved.

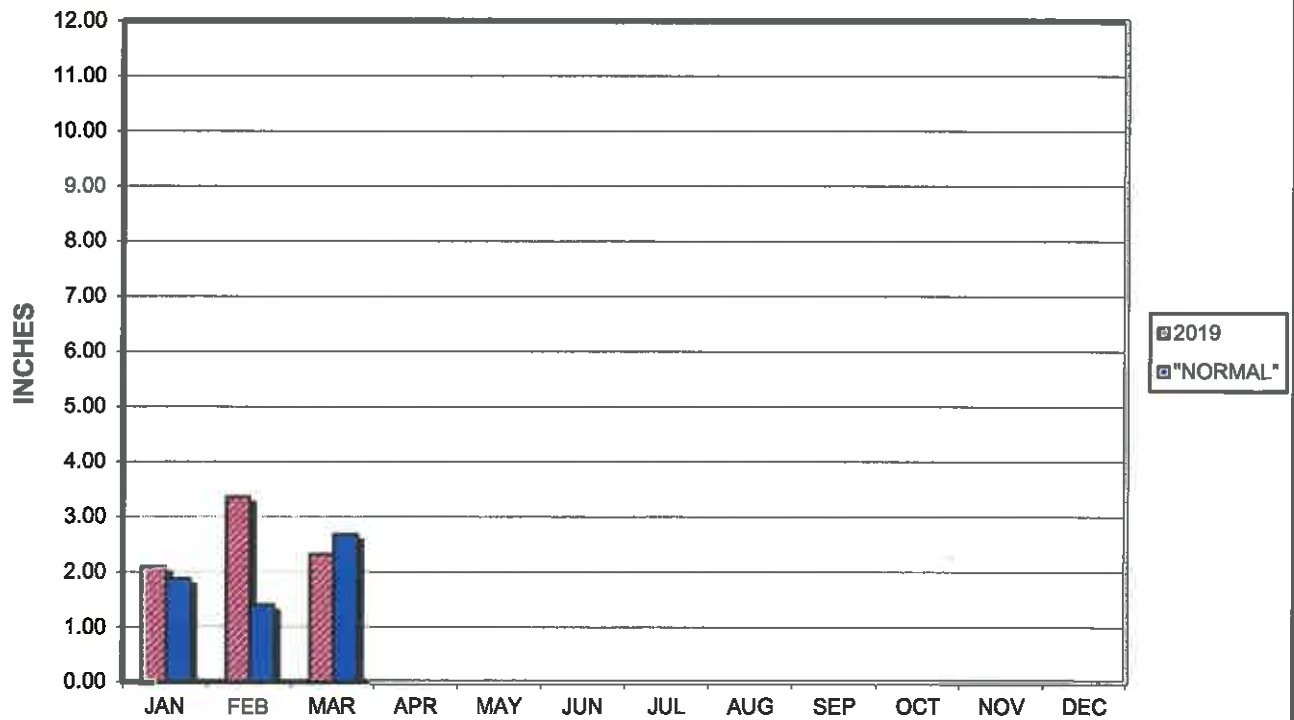

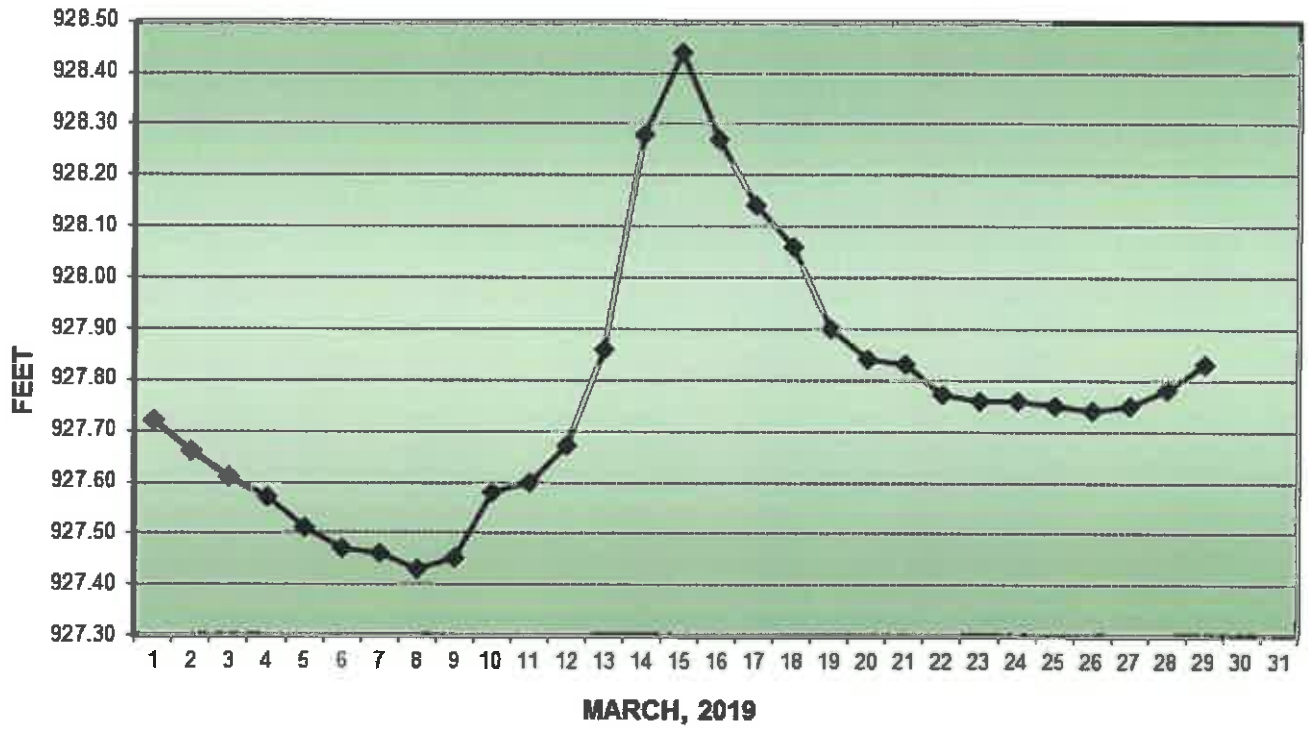
PRECIPITATION - DELAVAN LAKE, WI



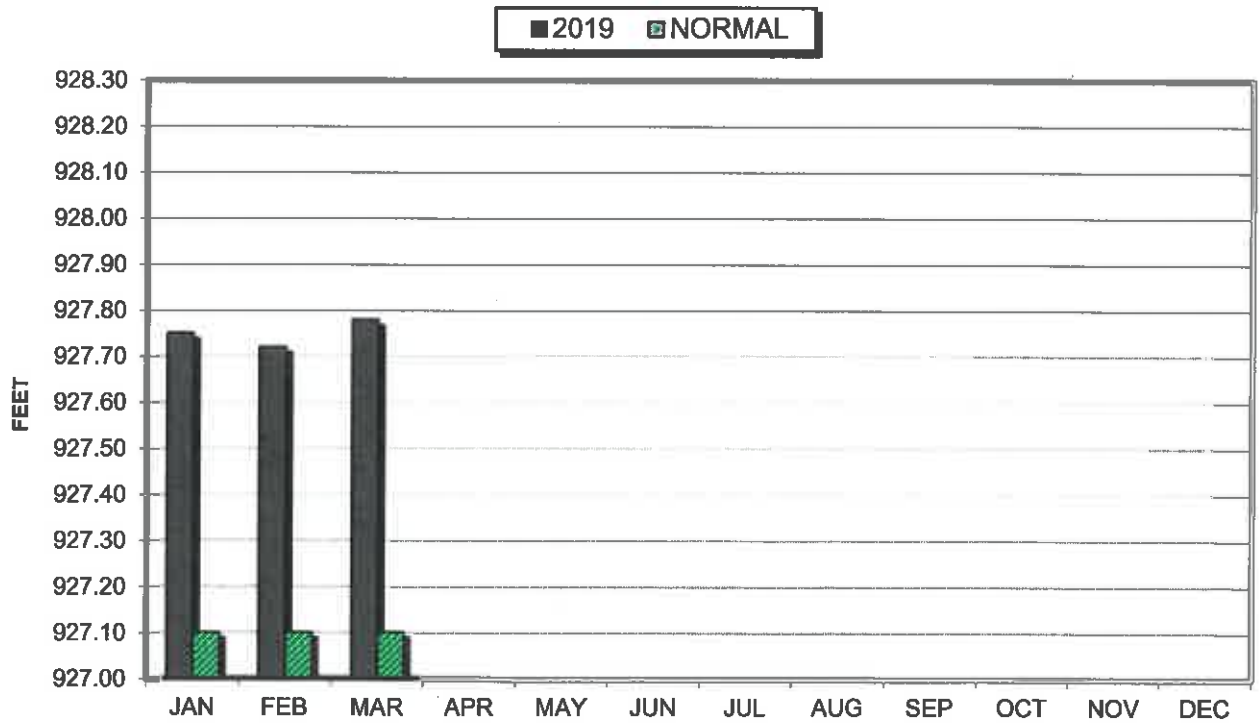
PRECIPITATION - DELAVAN LAKE, WI
